Social Security (SSI) & Disability (SSDI)

- 1. Social Security pays disability benefits under two programs:
 - Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) for insured workers, their disabled surviving spouses, and children (disabled before age 22) of disabled, retired, or deceased workers.
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI) for people with little or no income and resources.
- To be found disabled: must be unable to do any substantial work because of medical condition(s); and medical condition(s) must have lasted, or be expected to last, at least 1 year, or be expected to result in death. A doctor's statement of disability is not enough.
- 2. Apply online or obtain SSA-3368 Medical and Job worksheet (this will speed up the process and shorten the interview): medical records and tests, dosages of prescribed medication, W2, social security no., employment records, marriage/divorce records, workers compensation documents, family member details, bank account required <u>http://www.ssa.gov/dibplan/dapply.htm</u>
- 3. Interview: Social Security representative will interview you and complete an application for disability benefits and an Adult Disability Report, at local Social Security office or by telephone,1 hour. 180 Knights Way, Suite 100, FDL, WI 54935, 1-888-717-1526, WI.FO.Fond.Du.Lac@ssa.gov, fax: 920-921-4446.
- 4. The state agency may send forms or ask for an examination or medical test, at no cost to the client. If the state does request this, **make sure to keep the appointment**.
- 5. Application may take at least 3-5 months to be processed. At least 60% of first time applicants are rejected, but there are levels of appeal available. Final acceptance may take up to 3 years.
- 6. An attorney or advocate may help with the submission of the application and appeals, but will take payment of 25% of past due benefits first disability payment of up to \$6000. They may also charge out of pocket for administration expenses, for +/- \$200.
